

New Bern

Historic New Bern is a charming riverfront town tucked away on the banks of the Neuse and Trent rivers. It has been called one of the 5 best cities in America by Good Morning America. New Bern offers many unique boutiques, restaurants and historic homes for visitors to enjoy. History, music and art abound with various special events scheduled throughout the year.

In 1710, Swiss baron Christopher de Graffenried founded New Bern, the second oldest town in North Carolina. He named the city after his home Bern, Switzerland. In 1895, New Bern officially became the "daughter" city of the Swiss capital. The bear, which you will see displayed throughout the city, comes from the Swiss city's name.

Historic New Bern offers over 150 sites included in the National Register of Historic Places. New Bern was the capital of the colonial government and home to the First State Capitol of North Carolina, the Tryon Palace. Completed in 1770, Tryon Palace was built by British Governor William Tryon and served as the capital building until 1778. Tryon Palace hosted many famous Americans, including George Washington.

New Bern is also known as the birthplace of Pepsi Cola. In 1893 a local pharmacist Caleb Bradham invented the recipe, a blend of kola nut extract, vanilla and "rare oils" for what was originally called "Brad's Drink" and in 1898 renamed Pepsi-Cola.

This Month in New Bern History

In the 1930's, comedian and witty political commentator Will Rogers was quite popular. But during August of 1933, Rogers wrote a newspaper column about New Bern that created a furor. What happened and why?

Over the years New Bern became a busy trading center and needed governmental services such as a post office and courthouse. By the 1930's the town had outgrown the 1897 building at the corner of Pollock and Craven Streets, so the U.S. Department of Treasury decided to build at a new location on Middle Street.

The new building was designed by local architect Robert F. Smallwood in 1933 and was planned and built using costly decorative materials like marble and bronze. By the time it opened on April 1, 1935 it cost just under \$300,000, which made it one of the most expensive buildings in eastern Carolina. Quick to spot government waste and extravagance, Will Rogers lambasted the cost of the building as well as the Congressman who obtained the funding for it, though professing to not know his name. On August 27, 1933 he wrote in a national newspaper column,

"...how I ever overlooked a town that would demand a mail structure costing \$260,249! Well it just shows that I evidently overlooked the metropolis of that fine old state. This name may hit you too as rather unique as your thoughts. Go to a roster of North Carolina citadels. It's New Bern, NC. I repeat that, New Bern." He then continued, "... an awful lot of people that like to write letters for no reason at all, and they seem to be in doubt as to who to write to, so I will ask anyone in that state of mental incapacity to please write to New Bern, NC. I hate to see a \$260,249 post office not be slightly used anyhow. Now naturally the town (or city rather) being new to you, you won't know who to write to. Well in that case I would write to their Congressman. I don't know his name now, but he will become famous in a very short time, for he will not doubt have the capitol at Washington moved there."

Making fun of Congressman Charles Abernathy was one thing, but making fun of the town was quite another. Residents flooded Rogers with letters that included Alderman John F. Rhodes, whose letter was posted on the front page of the New Bern Tribune on August 29, 1933. "It is a matter of keen regret that one so well read and extraordinarily traveled as yourself should have missed our fair city, the Athens of North Carolina. City Clerk is taking steps immediately to see this phase of your education is not longer neglected. You will receive literature on New Bern by airmail. We extend you invitation to be present at dedication of our post office unless old age prevents you from making trip."

Rogers did post a public response but it did little to appease the hurt and indignant townspeople. Will Rogers did not attend the dedication of the Federal Building nor did he ever visit New Bern. It should be noted, however, that in 1973 this architecturally significant building was placed on the National Register of Historic Places and still stands proudly today at 413 Middle Street.

Mary Somerset and the Globe Amaranth

As a child, I enjoyed spending time in the small garden behind my grandparents' white one-and-a-half story home in a tiny Midwest farming town that modernity was rapidly leaving behind. My grandmother was an extraordinary gardener, growing a wide variety of flowers that she dried and used in arrangements—straw flowers, statice, yarrow, and globe amaranth. I was particularly fond of the globe amaranth's colorful, round blossoms like so many pink, magenta, and purple gumballs.

When dried, they were just as colorful, and the papery blossoms were fun to touch.

Globe amaranth (*Gomphrena globosa*) is not native to North America. Rather, it was one of the myriad plant species imported into Europe from Central America during the 17th and 18th centuries. Key to its introduction into English gardens was Mary Somerset (1630 – 1715), the first Duchess of Beaufort.

Twice married and the mother of nine children, the duchess cultivated renowned gardens at her estate, Badminton, and London home, Beaufort House. She carried on a correspondence with her London neighbor, Sir Hans Sloane (founder of the British Museum), as well as other leading natural historians and botanists, comparing notes on the plants that they grew from seeds sent from the Americas and across the globe. Far from being an amateur, the duchess experimented with her plants, taking meticulous notes and even adding corrections to the published botany books in her library. She compiled a 12-volume herbarium, consisting of pressed plant specimens and notations; these were passed to Sir Hans Sloane and became part of his expansive natural history collection.

This year the state of North Carolina kicked off its campaign to mark the 100th anniversary of the 19th Amendment to the US Constitution, granting women the right to vote. The theme for the campaign is, "She Changed the World." Change is sometimes invisible, forgotten, seemingly small or insignificant. Mary Somerset was never invited to join the Royal Society (the first female fellow was not admitted until 1945), even though she corresponded with prominent members. Her herbarium was never published or widely circulated. Her gardens at Badminton and Beaufort are no more. And yet her legacy lives on, in the brightly colored gumball blossom of the globe amaranth, growing in my grandmother's garden.

The Ice Cream Man: Trent Park, Summer 1959

Somewhere deep in the brain a connection is made. The subliminal sound from far off in the neighborhood registers and drags you from your intense digging in the damp sand beneath the willow tree. It's the ice cream man!

The adrenaline rush fuels your body as you spring up and run for home, hoping. *Will she give you the dime?*

He is closer now. As you approach your house you can see the other kids sprinting on their own procurement missions, each one triggered by the tinkly-tink music of the truck bearing fudgesicles and creamsicles and popsicles safely through the swelter of summer. Your sandals pound on the sidewalk as you reach your own screen door. Inside, mother can be seen in silhouette at the ironing board. The screen door slams. *Mama, can I? Can I, please? The ice cream man, mama!*



You've caught her in a reverie. Who knows what mothers think about as they work? What must their daydreams be? She smiles, turns slowly, reaches for her purse. Outside the ice cream music is louder. *Hurry, mama! He's coming!* you think but do not utter as you wait for her to make her way at excruciatingly slow speed through the process of retrieving a single silver coin from the myriad items in that old purse. Your body vibrates and pulses; bounces up and down.

At last you see the coin. Almost in slow motion, it comes up glinting amidst lint debris clenched between her thumb and forefinger. In a flash it is yours. You grasp it now with small fat fingers and, as if propelled by jets, burst from the house triumphant. (A faint snapshot of her smile imprints in the recesses of your mind where it will reside for all time.) You hit the yard running. Too late! The ice cream man has made the turn. Oh, no. But ahead you can see the boys – Ray and Carol and Billy – are going to cut him off. He sees them in the rearview mirror and instantly the brake lights flash. *Hooray!*

With white uniform, white hat and shiny black shoes, the ice cream man moves from the front seat to the refrigerator door in one smooth motion, a chrome changemaker jangling at his belt. When the door opens, the smoky cold escapes giving us a little arctic blast as we huddle around the ice cream man, hands out to receive our prizes from inside the frostbitten compartment.

In moments, the four of us are huddled once more in the willow-shaded sand box, tearing at the paper, and licking at the drips that still manage to hit our bare legs. We are laughing. Bragging. Teasing. And enjoying our victory. The day is hot. The ice cream is cold and sticky. Life is good.

New Bern was settled in 1710 by Swiss and Palatine German immigrants led by Baron Christoph DeGraffenried. The new colonists named the settlement after Bern, the capital of Switzerland and hometown of their leader. Many years before New Bern was settled, Bern, Switzerland was founded by a group of hunters who named the city after the first animal they came upon on their hunting expedition...a bear! "Bern" is the old Germanic word for bear, and the bear became the symbol of the city. The bear symbol was passed along to Bern's sister city, New Bern, and still serves as the city's mascot with bear flags and statues featured throughout the town.

New Bern celebrated its 300th Anniversary in 2010 by hosting a variety of festivities. In honor of the anniversary, over 50 fiberglass, ceramic bears, sponsored and adopted by local businesses, were situated throughout the city. Once local businesses chose to sponsor and adopt a bear, a year-long process began which included selecting a local artist to design the bear's theme, and designating a display location for the bear. Originally, 50 bears were erected and since an additional 11 bears have been created and positioned at various locations throughout the city.

3-4 Slices of limes

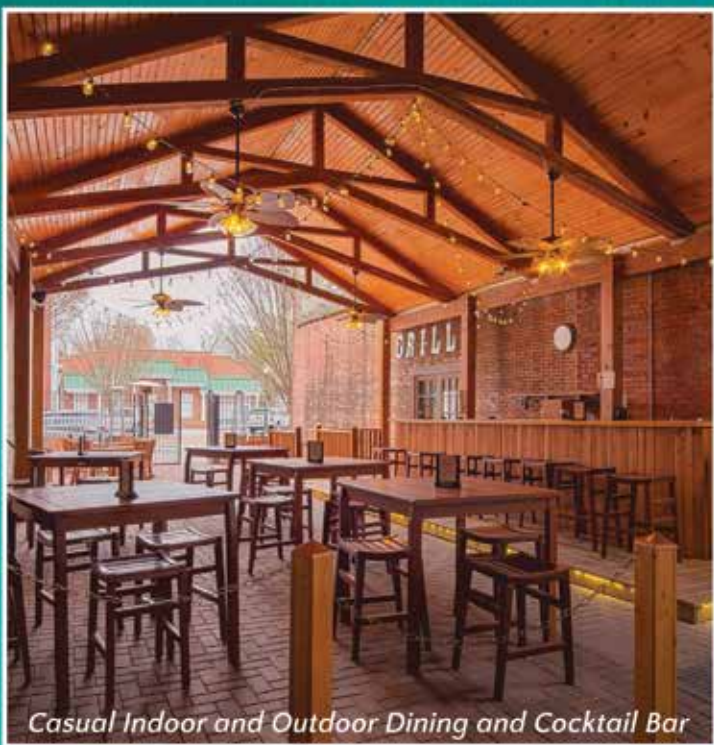

There's a local 'Dragon Masters' club of paddlers who practice from April until October. The group proudly possesses its very own dragon boat, named Miss Minerva!

The community also hosts kayak enthusiasts, cyclists, birders, and is a popular gathering spot for a variety of artists, potters, great musicians, and the intriguing Oriental History Museum. Forget your watch – and maybe even your cell phone – when you visit. According to ancient Indian legend, this is the spot where 'water meets the sky' and the area's laid back lifestyle is remarkable!

Oriental is blessed with a variety of places to spend one or more nights. There are two quaint, waterfront motels, and B&B's that are fabulous. Gift shops are exceptional, and there's even a women's fine apparel shop brimming with classic and casual outfits. The restaurants feed plenty of folks – especially during the warm weather months. You'll enjoy seafood, Southern home cooking, great steaks, a well-stocked deli, and award winning pies by Ms. Sil.

Here is a place like none other! Small town charm, friendly people, water everywhere, and old-fashioned fun all evolve into a lovely frame of mind that locals refer to as 'River Time.' Do yourself a favor and visit Oriental soon. Spend a day here, or maybe even a lifetime!
