



## The Hallowed Ground Lantern Tour: A Living History

The New Bern Historical Society will be presenting The Hallowed Ground Lantern Tour on March 21-23 from 6-9 pm in the New Bern Battlefield Park. Now in its third year, the park is the site of the first Battle of New Bern, and the storytelling event includes a lantern-lit walk through the wooded battlefield trails. The participants will engage with real characters, telling their historically accurate and poignant narratives dating from 1862-1865. In addition to the tour, a re-creation of a Civil War Field Hospital will be set up in a tent on the parade ground, involving the 7<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> NC Regiments and local performers.

Marissa Moore, Programs Director, says "The Lantern Tour is a fairly new program that emerged during Covid when we needed outdoor events. We chose this event to bring folks into the New Bern Battlefield Park which




is an ideal environment for storytelling about the war, and the lives of the people during that time—and not just the combatants. The stories we tell are from everyday people, such as individuals who were enslaved, emancipated, nurses, spies, or widows. The accounts are based on letters, articles, and autobiographies, and are heavily historically researched. The focus is to give people a peek behind the curtain and to see a different viewpoint on the Civil War than what is normally told."

The Historical Society does a particularly good job of sharing stories that are inclusive and diverse, and they seek out unusual and untold chronicles. "A huge part of our histories are African American stories that focus on people that are not necessarily in the mainstream," says Marissa. "For example, the story of William Henry Johnson, a freedman who fought for the Union without receiving pay, or MaryAnn Starkey who was a prominent New Bern businesswoman who owned a boarding house, or Aunt Rachel who was a cook for General Burnside. Aunt Rachel was united with her son who was sold into slavery, while she was a slave herself."

The Lantern Tour has become a very popular event in New Bern, perhaps because the tone is significantly different than the Ghostwalk event. "The Lantern Tour is aweinspiring," says Marissa. "It begins by walking through the woods and into the actual Civil War battlefield, onto hallowed ground. The authenticity of the environment creates a vibe that is thought-provoking, compelling, serious, and often heart-wrenching. The stories are real, told in the character's own words. Audiences often cry, laugh, and make comments like, 'I've lived here all my life, and I've never heard that story before.' The heartbreak, the triumph, and the resilience are very emotional."

The Lantern Tour event directly supports the arts community, by involving actors,

directors, costumers, and lighting designers. "We have an amazing talent pool in New Bern and all of our actors and directors are volunteers." says Marissa. "Our actors come from all walks of life in New Bern, and some are associated with New Bern Civic Theatre and Rivertowne Players, but others have simply found their niche with the Lantern Tour. It's different than being on stage in that they are in very close proximity to the audience, so there is an immediacy. Their experience as actors is also different in that they are performing outside in the elements more than 20 times per evening over three days. Some of the people involved are directors Nancy Hitchcock and Heide Lock; costume designer Maryann Murphy; and actors Laura Miller-McLemore, Dick Peebles, and Nelda Coats."

The process of creating the Lantern Tour event takes a considerable amount of time and planning. First, the staff must meet with all the players and decide on a date for the event, which happens in November of the previous year. Next, a committee discusses what stories they would like to tell during the upcoming year,


and they begin to start their research. "The fun part of the process is writing the scripts and beginning to narrow down the research to create a story," says Marissa. "Auditions begin in January, and then rehearsals begin. Tickets go on sale in February and we are into final dress rehearsals by early March."

The Lantern Tour is generously sponsored by Trader Construction, a local New Bern business since 1957, providing general construction services and supporting over 200 employees.

The mission of New Bern Historical Society is to celebrate and promote New Bern heritage, and to help support preservation and tourism.

New Bern Historical Society is led by **Executive Director, Mickey Miller** who is a retired attorney and Army colonel who spent most of her service in the Army JAG Corps. Mickey has volunteered with the Master Gardener Volunteer Association, Historic Downtown Residents' Association, and Chamber of Commerce, and has served as a commissioner on New Bern's Historic Preservation Commission. She is passionate about New Bern and community service and is thrilled to combine the two in her position as Executive Director.

Marissa Moore, Programs Director for the Historical Society, attended the United States Naval Academy in Annapolis, MD and graduated with a degree in history. Most recently, she was the Marine Corps Base Hawaii Branch Director for the Armed Services YMCA, where she developed and led programming tailored to support military families. With a passion for history and a heart for nonprofit work, she has found her home with the Historical Society and enjoys leading the wonderful programs they offer.



## **Oriental's Anniversary Celebration**

#### THE CELEBRATION:

Oriental, North Carolina—founded on March 4, 1899—is celebrating its 125<sup>th</sup> birthday on the weekend of March 1-3. Residents and visitors are invited to the three-day merriment, to enjoy the uniqueness of a town known for having more boats than people!

"As the Mayor, I love to welcome people to the Sailing Capital of North Carolina," says Sally Belangia. "Oriental is known for its commercial fishing, sports fishing, and active retirement community. Even though we have 928 people today, we never get bored. We have a festival or an event happening every month in the town. We are a town full of wonderful people who come from all over the world with great skills and talents. We also have many nonprofits, churches, and great local businesses."

The festivities will begin Friday morning, March 1st, at the Town Hall at 9:00 am with refreshments and a reading of the proclamation by the Mayor. Following Mayor Belangia, many of the town residents will be sharing fascinating stories about Oriental from over five decades from 9:30 am to 12:30 pm. The stories will include tales about growing up in the area, living on the water, fishing, swimming, sailing, and remembering a time of sawmills, trains, and railroads. There will be historian talks later in the afternoon at the New Village Brewery. In the evening, the original play, "Breakfast at Brantleys," written by Bill Gould, will be performed at 7:30 pm at The Oriental Theatre, performed by the Dragon's Den Theatrical Troupe.

On Saturday, March  $2^{nd}$ , the local Farmer's Market will be at Lou Mac Park, with vendors selling crafts and food. The parade starts at 11:00 am, followed by live music at the waterfront. The day will be filled with entertainment by local musicians, kids' activities, a sailboat parade on the Neuse River, and more. Saturday night will build up to an evening of dancing in the streets to live music!

On Sunday, March 3<sup>rd</sup>, Oriental United Methodist Church will have bluegrass gospel music; the Oriental History Museum will have storytelling at 2:00; and the Oriental Theatre will have a second performance at 3:00 of "Breakfast at Brantleys." The weekend

Throughout the year, this small town finds many reasons to celebrate and have fun, attracting thousands of visitors from North Carolina and beyond.



# This Month in New Bern History

March is Women's History month, so it is fitting to write about a famous daughter of New Bern who was well known in her day. Her name might not be familiar to you, but in 1859 Mary Ann Bryan Mason penned the first children's book written by a North Carolinian, A Wreath from the Woods of Carolina. Surprisingly, she did not make Gertrude Carraway's list of famous firsts in New Bern.

Mary Ann was born in 1802 to the prominent North Carolina family of John Council and Mary Ann Fulford Bryan. She grew up and was educated in New Bern. On June 10, 1823, she married Richard Sharpe Mason, who was born in Barbados, the West Indies. At the time of their marriage, Mason was the rector of Christ Episcopal Church in New Bern; he served in that capacity for ten years. The couple moved to New York in 1828 when Rev. Mason became the rector at St. Matthew's Church

in Geneva, NY and a year later was appointed President of Geneva College (now Hobart). The family moved to Delaware where Rev. Mason had a collegiate role, returning to North Carolina in 1840. He served as the rector of Christ Church in Raleigh for 35 years.

During this time the Masons had six children, and despite moving and caring for this large family, Mrs. Mason established herself as a notable painter, sculptor, and musician. In 1859 she penned A Wreath from the Woods of Carolina. The book has ten chapters that each begin with a bible verse and contain religious morality stories for children. Each story was illustrated by Mrs. Mason with a lovely colored engraving of a native wildflower. It was published by the General Protestant Episcopal Sunday School Union and Church Book Society of New York.

John Whitford in his popular *Rambles About Town* series, wrote in the New Bern newspaper *The Daily Journal*, January 7, 1883, "Mrs. Mason's neat and interesting work, prettily illustrated...should be read by every child. The stories in it are all founded upon facts and scenes that occurred in and about our town." This book is quite rare, but you can purchase one online for \$1600 if you wish. Luckily, if you would like to read it for free, the Kellenberger Room at the Craven County Library on Johnson Street does have a copy.

This book was well received, and Mrs. Mason wrote several others, most notably in 1871, The Young Housewife's Counselor and Friend, Containing Directions in Every Department of Housekeeping, Including the Duties of Wife and Mother. It was reprinted in 1875 with the cover title, Mrs. Mason's New Cookery.

Mrs. Mason died in 1881 and is buried with her husband at Oakwood Cemetery in Raleigh.



## Grant, Sherman Visit New Bern

Both of the Union Army's top generals traversed the railroad through New Bern in early 1865 during the final chapter of the Civil War. Major General William Tecumseh Sherman spent the night of March 25-26 in New Bern. The following month Lieutenant General Ulysses S. Grant – general-in-chief of the army – rode the rails through downtown on a secret mission to meet with Sherman.

By 1865, New Bern – occupied by Northern forces since 1862 – had become a vital supply center for the Federal forces focused on the seizure of Goldsboro, sixty miles to the west. Goldsboro was strategically important because it was the junction of two railroads. One of them, The Wilmington and Weldon, was still in Confederate control and running vital supplies from the open blockaderunner port of Wilmington to Robert E. Lee's rebel

army in Virginia. The other rail line, the Atlantic and North Carolina ran from Morehead City to Goldsboro. It was controlled by the Union only from the coastal town to New Bern. The A&NC link from New Bern to Goldsboro was a no-man's-land that had been scrapped over for years.

In 1865, General Sherman, after cutting a bloody swath with his forces across Georgia, and burning Atlanta on the way, decided that his ultimate destination was Goldsboro. N.C. Taking out that important rail junction, he concluded, would put the final stake through the heart of the Confederacy. Ironically, Maj. Gen. Ambrose Burnside, the

conqueror of New Bern, had the same idea and plan in 1862 before he and 8,500 of his soldiers were hurried out of New Bern to bolster troubled Union forces in Virginia. Had Burnside completed his N.C. mission, the Civil War might have been shortened by years.

After a series of remarkable battles in early 1865, the railroad between New Bern and Goldsboro was seized and repaired by Union troops. One of the first eastbound passengers was no less than Sherman himself. He spent the night in New Bern before boarding the steamer *Russia* Sunday morning March 26 on his way to powwow with Grant in Virginia.

Grant traveled to a secret Raleigh rendezvous with Sherman the following month. Coming shipboard to Beaufort, he passed by rail through darkened New Bern streets on the night of April 24, 1865.



## Severing the Ties that Bound

Lindy Cummings, Tryon Palace

In early August 1778, lames Flett entered the print shop of James Davis, located on Front Street (near presentday Craven County Courthouse). Flett either carried a slip of paper or dictated to Davis or an apprentice an advertisement that cost three shillings (roughly the cost of two bottles of imported beer at Edward Batchelder's nearby store). It ran for one day on page four of The North-Carolina Weekly Gazette:

WHEREAS my wife KATY has eloped from me, I take this public method to inform all persons

from trusting her own my account, as I will not be answerable for any debts she may contract from the date hereof.

A few weeks later, William Hales placed his own notice, "my wife Betty has eloped from me...I shall not pay any debts she may, after this date, contract." In 1796, Leven Dickenson also leveraged the local paper to announce that he would no longer be responsible for the debts of his wife, Beersheba.

What was happening? In a period when divorces were difficult, if not impossible, to secure, women like Katy Flett, Betty Hales, and Beersheba Dickenson were practicing "self-divorce" by leaving their husbands' households. Historian Clare Lyons points to similar Philadelphia advertisements that the ads drew on legal traditions by severing financial responsibility. "Under English common law," Lyons writes, "a wife had the right to a husband's financial support, and a husband had the obligation to support her."

While these ads show us that a very few 18th-century New Bernians ended their marriages by leaving the "bed and board" guaranteed them by their husbands, what these ads don't tell us is why they chose to do so. In the case of Katy Flett, we get a small hint about marital discord. A local store owner publicly rebuked James Flett for his treatment of Katy and for attempting to ruin her character. Given the small size of New Bern in the late 18th century, when subscribers to Davis's Gazette opened that week's edition, they were probably unsurprised to learn that their neighbors had ended an unfortunate marriage.

# An Interview with Veronica Campos-Hallstrom

By Jonathan Burger, Craven Arts Council & Gallery, Inc.

# Where are you from and how did you end up in Eastern North Carolina?

I am originally from Nebraska. After thirty years of being a military spouse, relocating on average every three years, we decided to call Eastern North Carolina our permanent residence because of the mild winters, natural coastal plains, beaches, barrier islands, and rivers. I should also mention the quintessential Southern hospitality and familiarity of military presence and support in this community.

# Does your work have a central theme or several different themes?

I am what is known as an Anthophile person. That is, someone who loves flowers. It is natural for me to focus on florals, leaves, and



vines which are recurrent in my art. I am inspired by intense colors. In essence, my creative process often revolves around capturing nature's beauty to share its inherent magnificence. I have an illustrative style that is flowing and expressive from layers of lines and color.

# You teach at Craven Community College, what relationship do you see between your teaching and your studio practice?

I was recently selected as a finalist for this year's Adjunct Faculty/Instructor Excellence Award. My teaching profession mimics many of my studio practices in aspects of organization, commitment, and desire to be a life-long learner. Each day I enter my art studio door, I have a ritual (much like in my classroom), to be mindful of my goals for the day, to show up as a dedicated professional, and to be open to learning and developing new skills that will make me a more well-rounded person.

# You also do pattern design work for textiles and other mediums. How does this relate to your one-off, more unique works?

It is true that pattern designing for textiles and other mediums involves creating repeatable designs suitable for mass production, as opposed to one-of-a-kind art. Original art can be transformed to get to that point. I can use the industry standard approach to incorporate my original art, translating it digitally for my textile design efforts. This allows me to diversify my art. It's a challenge and a thrill to be able to take my art in new directions.

# You have organized a Sketch Club, where local artists meet and do live drawings at different locations in New Bern. What are the benefits of that technique, and how do people find out more about it?

I formed the Craven Sketch Club from a desire to encourage others to maintain a healthy habit of drawing routinely. While I feel that adding to my sketchbook daily is a rhythmic behavior, others may need encouragement, accountability or an opportunity to be inspired. Once a month I pre-arrange and partner with businesses in Craven County, to extend a

# Is there another artist whose work you admire or who inspires you?

I am inspired by the use of natural forms by British textile designer William Morris. Philip Taaffe is an American mixed-media artist who incorporates many layers and exuberant colors into images. Frida Kahlo was emboldened to overcome hardships and as a Mexican representative, she is inspiring me with the use of our shared Mexican folk culture. Personally, my late Mother has had the most influence over me in my formative years. She often incorporated bright colors in her sewn creations, infusing joy and pride into the creative process. I hope to own her same skillset of always asking "What if?" to continue to propel me daily to experiment and explore as an artist.

#### Do you have any advice for an artist or those wanting to get into the arts?

Show up every day for yourself. Continue to solve creative problems and explore using your mediums of choice. Embrace your uniqueness. Seek constructive feedback. Gain a healthy habit of maintaining a sketchbook to cultivate a passion for ideation and continuous improvement. Seek knowledge about the business side of art. Stay adaptable. And, it is very important to maintain a healthy work-life balance.

#### What piece, award, or exhibition are you particularly proud of, and why?

To date, I remain thankful and proud to have received a past grant from The North Carolina Arts Council. This support served as useful for professional development and propelled me to continue along a new exciting creative path as a textile designer.

#### In one sentence what is art to you?

Art is an expression of thoughts, emotions, and ideas using various mediums that I never want to live without.

Oh, what a delight! Enjoy watching them frolic!


